

WHAT WE ARE ALL ABOUT

Founded in 1635, Collège Saint-Charles-Garnier is a private high school with an average of 600 boys and girls and 20 international students. Our High School program offers a french immersion in the school and with our host families in an inclusive and wellcoming environment. No need to be bilingual, student only need to start with a level A2 of French.

In the heart of the city, this magnificent stone building enjoys an immense land. There is easy access to downtown and shopping centers.

Our College has different spaces available for the students:

- 3 gyms
- A large sports area with a soccer field, a soccer field and a 100 meter runway
- 5 well equipped science laboratories, including 1 robotics laboratory
- 2 Plastic Art rooms
- 1 classroom specialized for dance and interpretation
- 1 classroom specialized for music (and 7 other classrooms for practice)
- 1 library
- 1 cafeteria with affordable prices
- 1 auditorium



Collège Saint-Charles-Garnier has always made it a priority to provide a healthy, inclusive and welcoming environment. Our entire team of teaching and support staff works together to help students navigate the challenges of adolescence, guide their personal experiences and support their learning.

Dedicated **class tutor**: students benefit from the guidance that comes from every class group having its own teacher. As a direct **point of contact** between parents and the College, the tutor keeps **communication** flowing smoothly with a personal touch.

Our team of professional support staff includes a school social worker, guidance counselor and special education technicians, all dedicated to fostering student wellbeing and success.

They provide front-line services to meet the daily needs of the student (first aid, locker problems, elevator key loans, sports equipment loans, lost items, general information, etc.).

SUPPORTING STUDENTS SUCCESS AND WELLBEING



We have a group of **experienced host families** that have been part of the program for years.

We have a **various range of profiles**: families with young children or teenagers, young couples, retired couples, single parent families, etc.

Despite the different profiles and compositions of our host families, all of them embody **the values of our program and respect our policies.** They have all passed the verification process to become host families.

The life in a host family offers a real immersion experience, because all of them leave in a **French environment**. The families keep in touch with the school in order to discuss the students development.

The role of the families is to support all the aspects of the **students' life in Quebec** (the language, needs/health, the city, the weather, social practices, among others). Families do not see the student as a client or as an invited. **Students are member of the family**.

The homes are easily accessible by bus, bike or by foot from the school. They live in a safe neighborhood.

HOW DO WE CHOSE THE HOST FAMILY?

NEW FAMILIES ARE CHOSEN THROUGH A DETAILED PROCESS:
DOCUMENTATION, VERIFICATION, VISITS AND RECOMMENDATIONS.

- Criminal records and recommendations are always verified
- We match the personal information of the student with the family's profile
- We personally analyse the profiles and match the student (we do not work with an agency)
- You receive the information of your new family prior to your arrival to Quebec
- The host families' coordinator does a regular follow-up with host parents and student.


PEDOGOGICAL APPROACH

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY AND COMMUNICATIONS

THE COLLEGE INCLUDES THE FOLLOWING

- The entire community of teacher and students works with Google Apps for Education*
- All classrooms have been equipped with with smart boards for number of years already.
- All students have an electronic school agenda and can access a shared calendar for students and teachers.
- An education portal (app) provides a privileged channel for communication.
- An IT skills development program is in place.
- Interactive digital platforms are used in conjunction with standard exercise books.
- Students bring their own technology into the classroom (tablets and laptops) as well as using traditional paper and pens.

As your French keeps improving, you can also improve your English by participating in our English Immersion program. It allows our students to reach the objectives of English Language Acquisition (ELA). Supervised by a team of highly qualified teachers, the students will have:

- 175 additional hours of English classes
- 1 full day of activities in English per cycle of 10 days
- 1 language assistant from England is available
- Possibility of improving their English during a trip to England
- Possibility to participate in the programming of activities of the International Exhibition

UNIFORMS

International students, such as regular students of the College, must wear the uniform (also known as "The Collection") and comply with the rules established in this regard. Students have the liberty to mix and match items from the collection.

Top of the uniform

- International students may wear polos or white or black shirts that are not in the collection only if they wear the vest or sweater from the collection as well. These shirts or polos should resemble those of the collection (cut, without any type of print, extra pockets, folds, etc.).
- Short sleeve or long sleeves (white or black) will be allowed to be worn underneath the garments in the collection.). T-shirts are not allowed.

All other items must be from the collection

Bottom part of the uniform

- Beige pants and skirt: from the school collection only
- Black trousers and skirts: They should NOT necessarily be those in the school's collection, if they are straight and without any branded logos or extra folds. They should resemble as much as possible to the trousers of the collection. Black jeans are not allowed.
- The tights for the students must go to the ankle, and they must be white or black.

Shoes

- Tennis can only be used in Physical Education class
- · No sandals or boots or ankle boots allowed
- The students can not wear shoes with a heel of 4.5 cm or more. The shoes must be black, leather
 or suede, with a black or gray sole not exceeding 2 cm (same for the heels). They must not be
 damaged and must release the ankle completely. If it is a lace-up shoe, these should be black and
 tied.

Physical education uniform

Shorts, t-shirts and pants that don't belong to the collection can't be used. These garments must be used exclusively during the sports class. There are changing rooms available for students.

Winter clothes

It is not possible to wear jackets or sweaters (that don't belong to the collection) in the College. The procedure is to arrive to school, leave the jacket, sweater and snow boots in the locker and enter classes with the uniform only. Winter boots are not allowed inside classrooms.

If international students do not have winter clothes, we advise you to buy them here in Quebec, especially if they will spend a full year with us (it is advisable to have an appropriate winter jacket and boots). For both the staff and the host family it will be a pleasure to guide them and accompany them to buy their winter clothes.

For the first days of the class, the students must arrive wearing black pants / skirt and polo or white shirt (without logos). Jeans are not allowed.
